

## **Surgery (Chirurgie)**

### **Classes:**

The main classes for surgery are called "Interdisziplinäre Vorlesung 2.1 and 2.2 (IVL 2.1 and IVL 2.2)" of the second year. The lessons take place from Monday till Friday from 10.15 a.m. to 11 a.m/11:30 a.m for one academic year (2.1 in summerterm and 2.2 in winterterm)

The exams always take place at the end of the term.

For Erasmus students it is possible to do the exam of 2.1 and 2.1 in one term but you will have to learn the subjects of the lessons that you maybe missed in one term. But you can download many pdf-files of the lessons in Meditum (Vorlesungsmaterial)

There is no control of attendance during the lessons

Interdisciplinary lectures 2.1 and 2.2 contain also Internal Medicine and Specific pathology, so does the exam. So you can't do only one part, you have to pass the whole exam!!!

Topics: The lessons contain all subjects of surgery: general, visceral, cardiology, trauma, ...

A small part of surgery will be done in the lessons of IDV 1 in the first year. These are about 5 lessons which are a kind of introduction for surgery basics, you can go there if you are interested. ---

### **Practical Training:**

The practical training in surgery takes place in the first or the last 3 weeks of the term. It is called: "Blockpraktikum Chirurgie" and lasts 2 weeks. It contains skills training( sutures, plaster, ...) and a rotation in different sectors and the operating rooms and also some theoretical lessons. Due to the language level most incoming students will get their Blockpraktikum at the end, so that they can profit from their clinic rotation. But unfortunately at the end of the term there's a time conflict with the exams of the lectures of the 1st and 2nd year of medical studies (which are chosen of many incoming students). So if you stay only for one term it won't be possible to participate to these "Blockpraktika"

It is also possible to do a practical day in the oral and maxillofacial surgery (0.5 ECTS). This is obligatory for German students but not for Erasmus students.
